## Santa Giulia Bay is the one of most famous of Corsica's beaches and regularly features on lists of the world's most beautiful place!

It is easily accessible by car, as it is located about 350 meters from the main T10 road, very close to Porto-Vecchio.

The narrow paved road then leads to the beach, where there is a paid parking lot, costing around 10 euros per vehicle.

At the northern end of the bay, you'll find the Marine de Santa Giulia as well as Petraggione Beach.

The Santa Giulia pond, on the other side of the beach, is perfect for walks along its shores and for birdwatching. For those who enjoy walking, we recommend this loop starting from **(B)**, which allows you to get some elevation over the bay.

The descent from **(E)** down to the beach is steep but still accessible.



## Directions:

A) Start your walk by heading to the left for a round-trip to the Santa Giulia Marina.

**B)** Then walk along the entire bay towards the south.

Before reaching the stream, turn right to take a footbridge that will allow you to cross it. Continue along a track.

**C)** Pay close attention at this point, as it's easy to miss the path that branches off to your left. This path crosses a field and will lead you to a small gate. Then begin a long, well-marked ascent.

**D)** Then find the path that leads to the viewpoint by following the cairns.

This section is tricky, as you will need to climb over several rocks. We do not recommend attempting it with children.

**E)** The descent that follows is quite steep and winding, taking you through dense scrubland. Be especially careful with your footing, as the terrain can be uneven. This descent will bring you down to sea level.

F) After the Moby Dick hotel, head towards the lagoon via the small path to observe the birds.
